VISION PROCESS UPDATE

We may be on the other side of our VISION DAY back on April 13, when 32 of our leaders gathered under the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the Rev. David Born, our TCN Lead Consultant, but the process is still just in it's early stages. At the end of our Vision Day, five varying pictures of potential "mission targets" emerged.

The next step is underway: creating a Vision Statement which paints a picture of God's preferred future of where we are going together in the next 3-5 years at Gethsemane. There is a group of 8 of us working on this. Our goal is to present a draft to a larger group of Council leaders and Vision Task Force members for final refinements, and then seek approval at a special congregational meeting, all we hope before the end of June.

This Vision Statement then will be our blueprint for setting goals and objectives for the immediate future. I would hope we can convene a gathering of leaders as early as the end of the summer for a special "workday"/retreat to do this. It is likely we will find (or create) a need for task force(s) to take on some of the goals and plans.

The key Mission Targets we are presently working on are: Families with Children, Seniors, and Ourselves (for spiritual growth). We can hardly expect to make God-pleasing plans without discerning His leading. Jesus said, "without Me, you can do nothing." So, none of this happens without prayer. I would like to see a few prayer warriors emerge who will take the leadership in organizing a prayer vigil of some type as we move forward.

We still have our Vision Prescriptions to work on, of course, including an "audit" of our Preschool, as well as a look at the Building Fund and how it relates to our vision. We will need to organize a Task Force to plan netfishing events (like our VBS), as our prescriptions call for six events a year where the community has a chance to interact with our members on our "campus" in a non-worship setting. We will be offering again both the small-group home study on prayer, and the present study on "natural evangelism".

So there is plenty of Kingdom work to be done. May God bless us and you to discover how your giftedness can best serve.

HYMNS WE LOVE TO SING

O Savior, Precious Savior

LSB 527

O Savior, precious Savior, Whom yet unseen we love, O Name of might and favor, All other names above; We worship you, we bless you, To you alone we sing; We praise you, and confess you Our holy Lord and King.

The lyrics were written by Frances Ridley Havergal, she was the daughter of the Rev. W. H. Havergal. She was born at Astley, Worcestershire, Dec. 14, 1836. The music was by Arthur H. Mann, 1830 -1929. Five years later her father moved to the Rectory of St. Nicholas, Worcester. In August, 1850, she entered Mrs. Teed's school, whose influence over her was most beneficial. In the following year she says, "I committed my soul to the Savior, and earth and heaven seemed brighter from that moment." A short sojourn in Germany followed, and on her return she was confirmed in Worcester Cathedral, July 17, 1853. In 1860 she left Worcester when her father resigned the

Rectory of St. Nicholas, and resided at different periods in Leamington, and at Caswall Bay, Swansea, broken by visits to Switzerland, Scotland, and North Wales. She died at Caswall Bay, Swansea, June 3, 1879. Miss Havergal could speak several languages fluently including Greek and Hebrew. She did not claim for herself, a prominent place as a poet, but by her distinct individuality she carved out a niche which she alone could fill. Simply and sweetly she sang the love of God, and His way of salvation. To this end, and for this object, her whole life and all her powers were consecrated. She lives and speaks in every line of her poetry. Her poems are permeated with the fragrance of her passionate love of Jesus.

Her religious views and theological bias are distinctly set forth in her poems, and may be described as mildly Calvinistic, without the severe dogmatic tenet of reprobation. The burden of her writings is a free and full salvation, through the Redeemer's merits, for every sinner who will receive it, and her life was devoted to the proclamation of this truth by personal labors, literary efforts, and earnest interest in Foreign Missions.
